



The elementary Honors Math program is now in its 31<sup>st</sup> year in the Archdiocese. The program has been a successful one. In addition to the high quality of teaching in the program, there has always been a consistency in adhering to the selection criteria for admission to the program and successful completion of the culminating standardized assessments. You can enter this program either during 4<sup>th</sup> grade or 5<sup>th</sup> grade only. As published on the diocesan web site, the criteria for admission are the following:

- Consistent scores of 90 or above in the Math Composite Score for the Terra Nova Achievement Tests;
- Consistent scores of 80 or above in the Reading Component of the Terra Nova Test;
- Cognitive Skill Index of 125 (falling in the range of 125) in the InView ability test;
- Evidence of above average performance (85 or above) on the Math End-of-Level Mastery Test administered in June;
- Consistent grades of 90 or above in Math on the report card;
- Teacher recommendation indicating that the student's effort and study skills are of a quality suitable for participation in an honors program.
